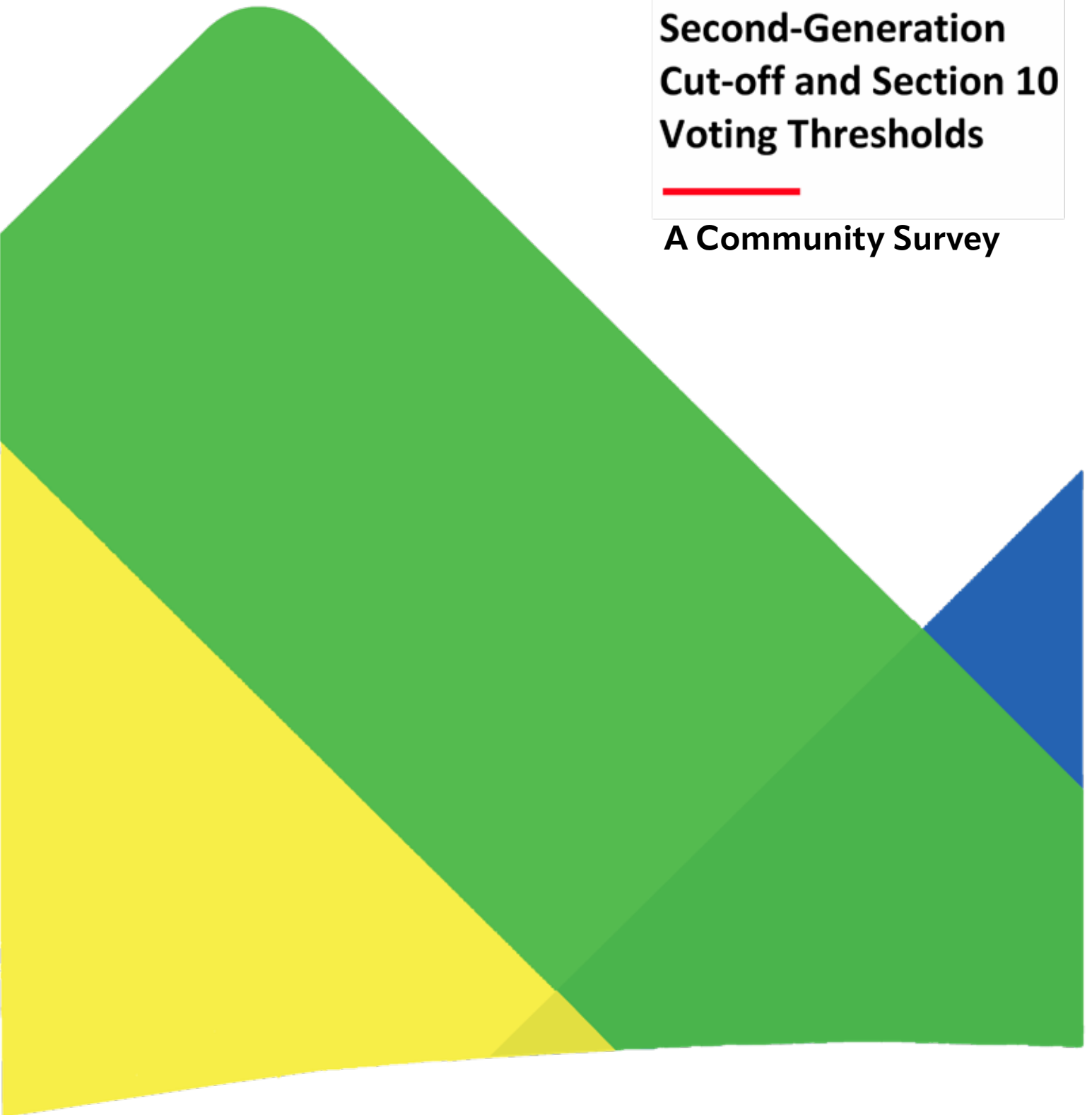


The Collaborative Process on the Second-Generation Cut-off and Section 10 Voting Thresholds

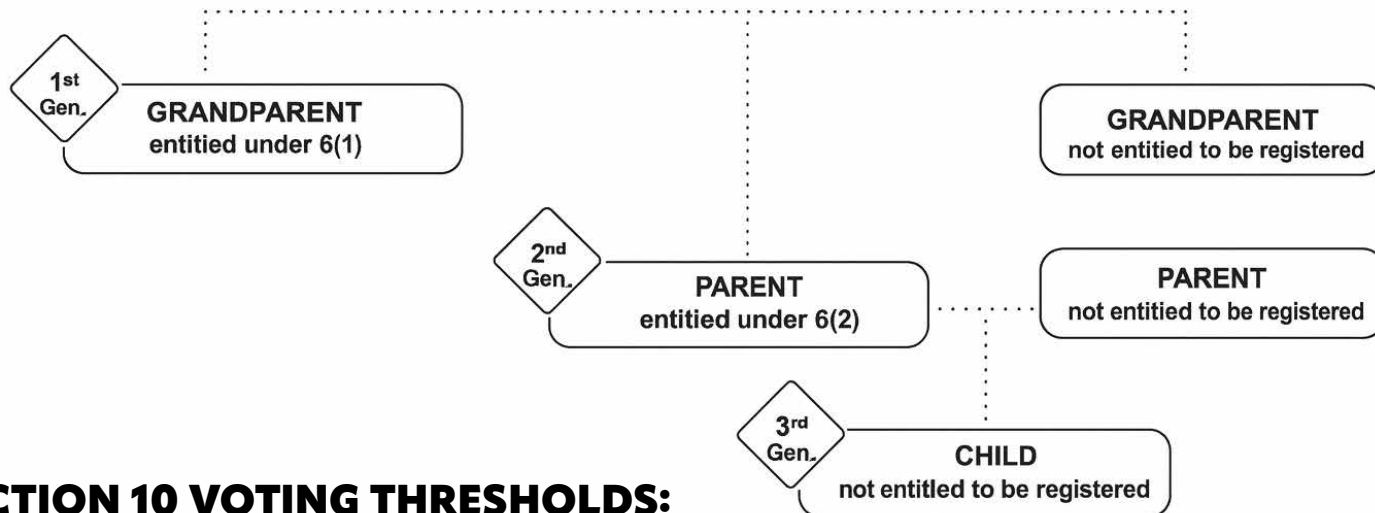
PEGUIS MEMBERSHIP SECOND GENERATION & THRESHOLDS REFORM

Community Survey

Peguis First Nation is participating in a national consultation on two key issues affecting our membership:

• **SECOND-GENERATION CUT-OFF:**

This term refers to a person who is no longer eligible for status because both of their parents and grandparents were non-status individuals. In other words, after two consecutive generations of non-status parenting, status is no longer passed down.



• **SECTION 10 VOTING THRESHOLDS:**

Peguis First Nation is already recognized as a Section 10 band, having adopted a membership code that was approved by the Minister. When a community decides to adopt or revise its code, it's important to ensure that the decision has strong support. Currently, this requires a "double majority"—meaning the vote must be approved by:

1. A majority of all registered band members, and
2. A majority of those who actually cast a vote.

Even though Peguis is already a section 10 band, it is important to know how we should conduct our vote should we decide in future to amend our code.
